



SAMPLE WORKSHEET FOR

Measurable/Achievable Goals for the Week of Mission

SMART GOALS

Specific – so they are well defined and not ‘wooly’

Measurable – so they can be measured to see success

Achievable – no point in doing something you can’t achieve

Realistic – are they realistic?

Time-limited – no point in setting aims which will take 5 years to complete

Goal #1 Make the youth in the neighborhood aware of our church youth group

Preparations **BEFORE** mission week for Goal #1

- A. Map out intended neighborhoods
- B. Prayer walk, drive or bike the neighborhoods
- C. Be sure all printing is done
- D. Put up Celebrate Jesus banner at the church and posters around the neighborhood announcing the Youth Volleyball Tournament & Goofy Olympics
- E. Obtain permission from the Community Pool/Skate Park to advertise and to approach youth about our upcoming event
- F. Obtain portable sanitation, trash cans, etc.
- G. Obtain workers for the evening of the Tournament/Olympics

Activities **DURING** mission week to achieve Goal #1

- A. Make door to door visits in family neighborhoods around the church
- B. Frequent the Community Pool/Skate Park and give out flyers
- C. Invite all the youth we meet to a Volleyball Tournament & Goofy Olympics on Thursday evening
- D. Give out popsicles and water at the Skate Park
- E. Set up refreshment stand, Volleyball Court & Goofy Olympic games
- F. Set up registration table and keep account of all contacts
- G. Have our youth in place to welcome everyone as they arrive and enjoy the evening!

Follow-Through **AFTER** mission week:

- A. Make follow up visits/calls to previously visited family neighborhoods
- B. Plan a “5th Quarter” event after the home football games for youth
- C. Create a position of “Events Coordinator” to work with the Youth Director
- D. Offer Youth Bible Studies and Prayer Groups
- E. Offer tutoring and mentoring to youth in community
- F. Seek out persons to begin a Youth Praise Band
- G. Always keep our prayer ministry active
